- (1) On the day after the day on which this Act receives Royal Assent, the Prime Minister must seek to negotiate:
 - (a) the backstop solution on Northern Ireland in the Withdrawal Agreement being superseded by an agreement as envisaged in Appendix A of the 11 March 2019 ‘Statement that Political Agreement has been reached’ that establishes alternative arrangements based on existing customs procedures and EU Regulations on a permanent footing to ensure the absence of a hard border on the island of Ireland while protecting the integrity of the EU’s internal market and the territorial integrity of the United Kingdom;
 - (b) limitation of extension of the Implementation Period until no later than Dec 2021;
 - (c) and omitting the words after “ambitious customs arrangements” in paragraph 23 of the Political Declaration Setting Out The Framework For the Future Relationship Between the European Union and the United Kingdom.”

- (1) If, at midday on the second last day before exit day, the condition specified in section 13(1)(d) of the Act (the passing of legislation approving a withdrawal agreement) is not satisfied, Her Majesty’s Government must immediately seek the agreement of the European Council under Article 50(3) of the Treaty to extend the date upon which the Treaties shall cease to apply to the United Kingdom based on a motion specified in subsection (2).
- (2) If, at midday on the last day before exit day, no agreement has been reached (pursuant to (1) above) to extend the date upon which the Treaties shall cease to apply to the United Kingdom, Her Majesty’s Government must immediately put a motion to the House of Commons asking it to approve ‘No Deal’.
- (3) If the House does not approve the motion at (2) above, Her Majesty’s Government must immediately ensure that the notice given to the European Council under Article 50 of the United Kingdom’s intention to withdraw from the European Union is revoked in accordance with United Kingdom and European law.”
