Repeal sections 60, 60AA and 60A of the Criminal Justice and Public Order Act 1994 in so far as they apply to England and Wales.

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen’s most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 Repeal of police stop and search provisions

- (1) The Criminal Justice and Public Order Act 1994 is amended as follows.
- (2) At the end of section 60 (powers to stop and search in anticipation of, or after, violence), insert—
 - “(13) This section does not extend to England and Wales.” 5
- (3) The following provisions are repealed—
 - (a) section 60AA (powers to require removal of disguises); and
 - (b) section 60A (retention and disposal of things seized under section 60).

2 Extent, commencement and short title

- (1) Any amendment or repeal made by this Act has the same extent as the provision amended or repealed. 10
- (2) This Act comes into force 14 days after the day on which it is passed.
- (3) This Act may be cited as the Police Stop and Search (Repeal) Act 2020.
