Amend section 13 of the Courts Act 2003 to change the retirement age for magistrates from 70 to 75; and for connected purposes.

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen’s most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 Amendment of the Courts Act 2003

- (1) Section 13 of the Courts Act 2003 (entry of names in the supplemental list) is amended as follows.
- (2) In subsection 1, for “70” substitute “75”.
- (3) In subsection 2, for “70” substitute “75”. 5
- (4) In subsection 3, for “70” substitute “75”.

2 Extent, commencement and short title

- (1) This Act extends to England and Wales only.
- (2) This Act comes into force four weeks after the day on which it is passed.
- (3) This Act may be cited as the Magistrates (Retirement Age) Act 2020. 10
