Because it is clearer for proportionality to appear as a separate consideration in the countervailing benefits exemption —(*The Chair.*)

Motion made and Question put, That the following Reason be assigned to the Lords for disagreeing to their Amendments 9 and 19 to the Digital Markets, Competition and Consumers Bill:

Because it is appropriate for the CMA to be required to act proportionately in relation to conduct requirements and pro-competition interventions.—(*The Chair.*)

Because it is appropriate for all appeals about the imposition of a penalty under Chapter 7 of Part 1 to be determined on the merits.—(*The Chair.*)

Motion made and Question put, That the following Reason be assigned to the Lords for disagreeing to their Amendment 104 to the Digital Markets, Competition and Consumers Bill:

Because protections for consumers in relation to secondary ticketing are adequately provide for under existing legislation (in particular Chapter 5 of Part 3 of the Consumer Rights Act 2015 and the Breaching of Limits on Ticket Sales Regulations 2018 (S.I. 2018/735).—(The Chair.)
