**Clause 1**

LORD MCCOLL OF DULWICH

- 1 Page 1, line 22, leave out from beginning of line 22 to end of line 2 on page 2 and insert—
- “(6B) The consent of the person concerned is only deemed once a person in a qualifying relationship affirms that the person concerned would not have objected to the activity.”

**After Clause 1**

LORD MCCOLL OF DULWICH

- 2 Insert the following new Clause—
- “Five year review of the effectiveness of deemed consent**
- (1) The Secretary of State must at least once in every five year period beginning with the day on which this Act is passed lay before Parliament a report which includes analysis and evidence on whether the introduction of deemed consent under section 3 of the Human Tissue Act 2004 has been effective in increasing the number of organ and tissue donations.
- (2) The report under subsection (1) must take into account other developments that may have affected the number of organ and tissue donations.”
- 3 Insert the following new Clause—
- “Duty to explain deemed consent**
- (1) The Secretary of State must inform the public about, and promote awareness of, the circumstances where consent to transplantation activities under section 3 of the Human Tissue Act 2004 is deemed to be given, and the role of relatives and friends in affirming that deemed consent.

**After Clause 1 - continued**

- (2) The duty under subsection (1) includes a duty to inform the public through an advertising campaign at least once a year.”

**4** Page 3, leave out line 5 and insert –

“(1) Sections 1, 2 and 3 extend to England and Wales.

(1A) Sections 2(2), 2(3) and 3 extend also to Northern Ireland.”
