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TO

Make provision for road safety measures in residential areas and for the indication of speed limits.

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 Amendment of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1994

Article 10 of Part II of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1994 (S.I. 1994/1519) is amended in paragraph (2) by omitting the words “except that the sign shown in diagram 670 shall not be placed” and substituting “and local traffic authorities shall have the power to determine whether the sign shown in diagram 670 should be erected”.

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2 Financial provision

There shall be paid out of money provided by Parliament any increase attributable to this Act in the sums payable out of money so provided under any other Act.

3 Short title and commencement

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- (1) This Act may be cited as the Road Safety and Speed Act 2002.
- (2) This Act shall come into force three months after it receives Royal Assent.
