Make provision about anti-social behaviour.

**B**E IT ENACTED by the Queen’s most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

**1 Additional powers of community support officers**

- (1) Part 1 of Schedule 4 to the Police Reform Act 2002 (c. 30) is amended as follows.  
(2) After paragraph 1 insert—

*Powers of arrest*

“1A Where a designation applies this paragraph to any person, that person shall have the power to arrest a person without a warrant in such circumstances as the Secretary of State may by regulations prescribe.” 5

- (3) In paragraph 6 (confiscation of alcohol) leave out from “area,” to the end of the paragraph and insert— 10

- (a) “have the powers of a constable under section 1 of the Confiscation of Alcohol (Young Persons) Act 1997 (c. 33)(confiscation of intoxicating liquor) —  
(i) to impose a requirement under subsection (1) of that section; and 15  
(ii) to dispose under subsection (2) of that section of anything surrendered to him;

and that section shall have effect in relation to the exercise of those powers by that person as if the references to a constable in subsections (1) and (4) (but not the reference in subsection (5) (arrest) were references to that person; and 20

- (b) such other powers in relation to the confiscation of alcohol as the Secretary of State may by regulations precribe.”

**2 Short title and extent**

- (1) This Act may be cited as the Anti-social Behaviour Act 2004.
- (2) This Act extends to England and Wales only.
