2 United Nations Security Council Resolution 1973

Motion made and Question put, That this House welcomes United Nations Security Council (UNSC) Resolution 1973; deplores the ongoing use of violence by the Libyan regime; acknowledges the demonstrable need, regional support and clear legal basis for urgent action to protect the people of Libya; accordingly supports Her Majesty's Government, working with others, in the taking of all necessary measures to protect civilians and civilian-populated areas under threat of attack in Libya and to enforce the No Fly Zone, including the use of UK armed forces and military assets in accordance with UNSC Resolution 1973; and offers its wholehearted support to the men and women of Her Majesty's armed forces.—(*The Prime Minister.*)

(a) Members' salaries, and

(b) additional salaries payable to Members under Resolutions of this House in respect of service as chairs of select or general committees,

shall be the same as those salaries as at 31 March 2011.

(2) In paragraph (1) the "relevant day" means—

(a) the day before the day on which the first determination of Members' salaries by the Independent Parliamentary Standards Authority comes into effect, or

(b) 31 March 2013,

whichever is the earlier.

(3) Paragraphs (9), (10) and (12)(b) of the Resolution of 3 July 2008 (Members' Salaries (No. 2) (Money)) cease to have effect on the day this Resolution is passed.

(4) The remaining provisions of that Resolution cease to have effect on 1 April 2011.—(*Sir George Young.*)
